

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF PRINCE

BY-LAW NO. 93 - 2

PARKING: being a by-law to authorize the provision of certain designated parking spaces for the sole use of vehicles operated by or conveying a physically handicapped person

THE COUNCIL of the Corporation of the Township of Prince, pursuant to section 210(1) paragraphs 119 and 150 of the Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1980, Chapter 302, as amended, ENACTS as follows:

1. In this by-law:

- (1) "corporation" means the Corporation of the Township of Prince
- (2) "designated parking space" means a parking space marked by a sign indicating such space to be for the sole use of a vehicle bearing an identifying marker issued in accordance with this by-law
- (3) "permit" shall mean a permit issued to a physically handicapped person on an annual basis or for periods of less than one year in the event that the handicap is of a temporary nature
- (4) "physically handicapped person" shall mean a person who is permanently or temporarily,
 - (i) confined to a wheelchair
 - (ii) required to use crutches, or other devices that restrict the mobility of the person
 - (iii) for medical reasons not referred to in subclause (i) or (ii), restricted in his or her mobility.
- (5) "sign" means a sign approved by the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Prince for the purpose of designating parking spaces for the sole use of physically handicapped persons
- (6) "unauthorized motor vehicle" means a vehicle that does not have affixed thereto a current identifying marker identifying the vehicle as one operated by a physically handicapped person or transporting a physically handicapped person



2. The By-law Enforcement Officer of the Corporation of the Township of Prince is hereby authorized to issue permits in respect of vehicles that are operated by physically handicapped persons or used to transport a physically handicapped person.

3. The By-law Enforcement Officer of the Corporation of the Township of Prince is hereby authorized to issue an identifying marker in connection with a permit issued pursuant to section 2.

4. No person, other than a physically handicapped person, shall acquire or use a permit in respect of a vehicle.

5. No person, other than a person who has acquired a permit pursuant to section 2, shall acquire or use an identifying marker issued in connection with a permit.
6. No person shall use, other than in the manner provided for in this by-law, an identifying marker issued in connection with a permit.
7. The identifying marker issued in connection with a permit shall be affixed to the sun visor of the driver's side of the motor vehicle in respect of which such permit was issued, and such identifying marker shall be affixed in such manner that it is readily visible from outside of the vehicle when the visor is turned down.
8. The By-law Enforcement Officer of the Corporation of the Township of Prince shall cause to be erected signs in the form of Schedule "A" to this by-law and upon the erection of said signs, the parking space shall be deemed to be a designated parking space.
9. No person shall park or leave an unauthorized motor vehicle in a designated parking space.
10. (1) Any person who contravenes any provisions of this by-law is guilty of an offence and on summary conviction is liable to a fine of not less than Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars, exclusive of costs.
 (2) Notwithstanding subsection 1, any person may, upon presentation of a notice of violation issued for n alleged offence under this by-law, pay out of Court, within thirty days, exclusive of Saturdays, Sundays and holidays, from the date of issue of the said notice of violation, the sum of Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars and upon payment being made, no further proceedings shall be taken under this by-law in respect of an offence alleged in this notice of violation.
- (3) If payment is not made in accordance with the procedures set out in subsection 2, the fine provided for in subsection 1 shall be recoverable pursuant to the Summary Convictions Act.
11. This by-law takes effect on the day of its final passing.

READ a first, second and third time and finally passed this 9th day of March, 1993.
