Amendment to Appendix C – By-law 2016-02  
Adding Appendix D to By-law 2016-02  
Being a by-law to regulate a Volunteer Fire Department.**

**WHEREAS** the *Prince Township Volunteer Fire Department* may be called to vehicle accidents;  
and

**WHEREAS** it may be necessary to reach an occupant in the vehicle; and

**WHEREAS** the *Prince Township Volunteer Fire Department* does not have hydraulic auto-  
extrication equipment;

**NOW therefore, the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Prince hereby** amends  
Appendix C of By-law 2016-02 to allow for response to vehicle accidents to stabilize the vehicle,  
and aid the occupants, while prohibiting hydraulic auto extrication.

The amended Appendix C forms part the By-law and replaces Appendix C in By-law 2016-02.

The Operational Guidelines (OGL) for auto extrication forms part of this By-law.

APPENDIX C**

**Amendment**

**Replacing Appendix C of By-law 2016-02**

The Prince Township Volunteer Fire Department is authorized to participate in the following activities and services:

- Fire suppression
- Fire prevention
- Fire safety education and communications
- Training
- First response to medical emergencies
- First response to vehicle accidents, including stabilization of vehicle and extrication of victims, using only non-hydraulic hand tools.

Prohibited activities include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Ice rescue
- Water rescue
- Hydraulic auto extrication
- Ambulatory services
- Forest fire suppression outside of the approved areas of jurisdiction
- High-level rescue (rappelling)

**Adding Appendix D to By-law 2016-02**

Operational Guidelines (OGL) for Auto Extrication

Prince Fire Department

2016 05 10

Auto extrication will consist of the following activities.

1. Deployment of fire extinguishers and hose lay for potential fire suppression.
2. Vehicle stabilization using wooden blocking, ropes or chains.
3. Opening engine hoods to disconnect batteries.
4. Opening trunk or hatch to gain access to the rear of the vehicle.
5. Removing windows using hand or power tools, including a battery-operated reciprocating saw.
6. Crimping fuel lines to protect against fuel spread and explosion.
7. Crimping of any line that is leaking fluid to prevent against environmental damage.
8. Primary care and removal of victims trapped in a vehicle.

Auto extrication **will not** consist of the following activities.

1. The use of hydraulic tools.
2. Cutting posts or support beams using **any** tools.
