

TOWNSHIP OF PRINCE  
DISTRICT OF ALGOMA

BY-LAW ##\_# 365.

The Township of Prince under the authority of the Dog Tax and Live-stock Protection Act enacts that there shall be enforced in the Township a By-Law requiring each owner or householder within the Township possessing one or more dogs to obtain a license for each dog, and requiring the registration of each dog with the proper officer of the Township. In each year the annual license fee for license and registration of each dog shall be as follows;

For one male dog \$2.00  
For each additional male \$4.00  
For one female \$6.00  
For each additional female \$12.00

Each applicant on paying this fee shall be entitled to an appropriate license tag, showing the year and consecutive number.

The person to whom the application shall be made will be the Township Constable, who is authorized to receive the fee and issue the tag. Application in each year shall be made on or before the last day of March. Anyone delaying application later than the date specified by this By-Law shall be subject to an additional fee of \$1.00 for each application.

It is also enacted that dogs found straying or running at large within the Municipality ~~xxxxx~~ may be impounded and destroyed or otherwise disposed of; but if a dog wears a tag the owner should be first notified by messenger or letter one week before such penalty action is taken.

For the purpose of this section a dog shall be deemed to be running at large when found on a highway or other public place within the Township of Prince, or on private property other than the owner's property and not on a leash. The owner of such dogs will be liable for any damage done by his dog.

Each person in disobedience of this By-Law shall be liable to prosecution under the Summary Conviction Act as provided by the Dog Tax and Livestock Protection Act, and subject to a penalty of not more than \$50.00 and costs of prosecution.

The Township Police are authorized to summon the owner of such offending dog, or the person who refuses to purchase the required license, before a Magistrate who may impose a suitable fine and may order the dog destroyed.

READ a first, second and third time and finally passed in open Council this Fifth day of April 1965.
