

A BY-LAW TO APPOINT A ROAD SUPERINTENDENT IN THE TOWNSHIP OF PRINCE

IN THE DISTRICT OF ~~COCKING~~ ALGOMA

WHEREAS it is desirable that the laying out and supervision of all work and expenditure upon improvement and maintenance of roads within the exclusive jurisdiction of this Council should be under the supervision of a Road Superintendent, acting under its direction.

AND WHEREAS it is the desire of this Council to take advantage of The Highway Improvement Act and to receive the Government grant as provided in the said Act.

BE IT THEREFORE ENACTED by the Council of the municipal corporation of the said township and it is hereby enacted.

1. That Gordon S. Marshall (name) R. R. #1 (address)

is appointed Road Superintendent in the said township to act as aforesaid in accordance with the provisions of the said Act from the 17th day of October 1968 and during the pleasure of the said Council. 2.00 ln.

2. That the Road Superintendent shall be paid at the rate of \$ 40.00 per month for such time as he may be so employed. and 11¢ per mile

3. THAT it shall be the duty of the superintendent to lay out and supervise all work and expenditure on roads within the exclusive jurisdiction of this Township Council in accordance with the provisions of the Highway Improvement Act.

4. THAT all by-laws or parts thereof and all and any resolutions of said Council contrary hereto or inconsistent herewith, be and the same are hereby repealed.

5. THAT two certified copies of this by-law be forwarded by the clerk without delay to the district office of the Municipal Roads Branch, Department of Highways Ontario.

6. THAT this by-law shall not come into force until approved by the Minister of Highways, as provided in the Highway Improvement Act.

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF PRINCE

BY-LAW NO. 369

Being a by-law requiring and regulating the filling-up, draining, cleaning and clearing of any grounds, yards and vacant lots within the Township of Prince

WHEREAS section 379 (1) (68) of The Municipal Act empowers councils or cities to pass by-laws for requiring and regulating the filling-up, draining, cleaning, clearing of any grounds, yards and vacant lots and the altering, relaying, or repairing of private drains.

THEREFORE the Council of the Corporation of the Township of Prince ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:


1. No person shall permit or allow on property owned or occupied by him, any holes, pits, excavations or trenches constituting a health, fire or safety hazard.
2. The owner or occupier of property shall keep such property including grounds, yards and vacant lots, clean, trimmed, brushed, mowed and free from all trash, garbage, used lumber, timber, automobile bodies or frames or anything that constitutes a health, fire or safety hazard.
3. Any person failing to comply with the provisions of this by-law, upon notice in writing forwarded from the office of the Township Medical Officer or By-law enforcement officer by prepaid first class mail addressed to such person at his address as shown on the last revised assessment roll, shall correct the situation or condition within ten (10) days of the mailing of the notice.
4. In the event that the situation or condition is not corrected upon notification as provided in paragraph 3 hereof, the Township Clerk or by-law enforcement officer may order or perform the work necessary to correct the situation or condition,

and such work shall be done at the expense of the owner or tenant of the property and the cost of such work shall be due and payable to the Corporation of the Township of Prince, and the said Corporation may recover the said expense by action, or the said expense may be recovered in a like manner as municipal taxes.

5. Delapidated buildings, which in the opinion of the By-law enforcement Officer, are a health or safety hazard, shall be considered as being covered by the provisions of this by-law and must be demolished under the same conditions as mentioned in Paragraphs 3 and 4.

6. Every person who contravenes any of the provisions of this by-law is liable to a fine of not more than three hundred dollars (\$300.00) exclusive of costs. Every such fine is recoverable under the Summary Convictions Act.

READ A FIRST, SECOND AND THIRD time and FINALLY
