### Food for thought, again!

The 2014 Election is fast approaching. Below are a few key dates and facts.

### Voting date:

Notwithstanding advance poll arrangements, the 2014 municipal election is scheduled for October 27, 2014 to select one Head of Council and four members of Prince Township Council, as well as a member of each of the four school boards. (English and French, Public and Catholic. (Please note correction for number of councillors from November newsletter.)

### **Nomination Period:**

Candidate registration opens on January 6, 2014 and ends on September 8<sup>th</sup>, 2014.

### Term Length:

The term of office for all positions is four years.

### **Qualifications for Municipal Office:**

A candidate for municipal office must, upon nomination, be a qualified municipal elector and fulfill all of the following requirements:

- a resident of the municipality, a nonresident owner or tenant of land in the municipality or the spouse of such nonresident owner or tenant;
- a Canadian citizen;
- at least 18 years old;
- · not legally prohibited from voting; and
- not disqualified by any legislation from holding municipal office.

NOTE: A candidate, if nominated, must remain qualified throughout the election and, if elected, throughout the term of office.

At the November 12, 2013 Council meeting, Council took the recommendation of the Park Committee and decided to name the park by the marina, 'Gros Cap Marina Park'.

There were recommendations regarding dedication plaques, a gazebo and a process for naming parks in the future. Council thanked the committee for their effort and viable recommendations.

The Committee of Adjustments and Council also approved an application which proposed that the majority of the Gros Cap Bluffs will be purchased by the Lake Superior Watershed Conservancy. This will allow for the development of trails for public use. Although the public has accessed this property in the past, it has been in private ownership. This approval will come into affect after the appeals period, provided there are no appeals.

The Township will be looking for a new candidate to fill the **NOHFC** intern position. See Saturday's Sault Star for full details, or call the office if you know someone qualified for this position.

### **Fire Department**

As you know, the winter season is knocking at our door. Heaters are turned on and wood stoves are cranked up.

Wood and pellet burning stoves can be effective tools for heating, but they also pose fire hazards that contribute to home heating equipment being the second leading cause of home fires.

The Prince Township Volunteer Fire Department would like to offer the following guidelines for safe use of wood and pellet burning stoves:

 Install the stove, chimney connectors and chimneys following manufacturer's instructions or have a professional do the installation.

- Wood stoves should have the label of a recognized testing laboratory.
- In wood stoves, burn only dry, seasoned wood. In pellet stoves, burn only dry, seasoned wood pellets.
- Start the fire with newspaper or kindling, never with a flammable liquid, such as lighter fluid, kerosene or gasoline.
- Keep the doors of your wood stove closed unless loading or stoking the live fire.
- Allow ashes to cool before disposing. Dispose of ashes in a tightly covered metal container and keep the ash container at least 10 feet away from the home and any other nearby buildings.
   Douse and saturate the ashes with water.
- Chimneys and vents need to be cleaned and inspected at least once a year.

### Also

- Test your smoke alarms and remember to replace the batteries
- If you burn wood or other fuel, consider purchasing a carbon monoxide detector, it could be a life-saver!
- If you already have a carbon monoxide detector, test it and remember to replace the

- batteries.
- Make sure your furnace or wood stove is in proper working order and check that the chimney is clear of any obstructions.
- Make a fire escape plan and be sure to practice, practice and practice!




### **Caring for Cut Christmas Trees**

Remember, a Christmas tree is a living thing. Look after it carefully as you would a cut flower. Once you select a Christmas tree, follow these suggestions to keep it fresh and safe:

- If you buy a tree several days before you plan to set it up, store the tree outdoors or on a cool porch or patio until you are ready to decorate it. An area that provides protection from the wind and sun will help the tree retain its moisture.
- 2. If you plan to store the tree for several days, make a straight cut across the butt end of the tree about one inch from the end. This opens the tree stem so it can take up water. Store the tree upright and place the butt end in a container of water.
- 3. When you bring the tree into the house for decorating, make another






