ATTENTION DOG OWNERS

You must register your dog(s) by March 1st to comply with the Township By-law

If obtaining a license for your dog has slipped your mind, please come into the Municipal Office, call 705-779-2992 or email

lorraine@twp.prince.on.ca as soon as possible to avoid prosecution. The cost is \$7.50 for spayed or neutered dogs or \$15.00 otherwise. Please bring in conformation of last rabies shot date. A licence must be purchased by March 1st

must be purchased by **March 1**st **2014**, after which there is a \$15.00 penalty – per dog.

Please remember that all dogs must be leashed in a public area.

COUNCIL & COMMUNITY NEWS

Here we are in the last month of the first quarter of 2014. Time flies when you are having fun!

Saturday, March 1, is Prince Township's Winter Fun Day! Come out and enjoy the activities from 11 to 3!



A letter was circulated in some areas of the municipality. This letter **did not** come from the Township Office. It stated that there would be a meeting on March 4, 2014. This is not accurate. **The March meeting is on the 11**th.

At the regular meeting of Council on February 11, 2014, an official plan amendment was presented under By-Law 2014-02 to change the designation of several properties to bring them into alignment with the proposed zoning by-law that was being considered at the same meeting.

The Council did not approve the requested amendments at the same meeting of February 11, 2014. Their reason for non-approval was that the Council was not in agreement with many of the rezoning changes that were being presented in the zoning by-law and therefore some of the changes to the official plan would not be appropriate.

The last date for filing a notice of appeal is March 14, 2014. Any notice of appeal must:

- i) be filed with the clerk of the municipality
- ii) be accompanied by the fee required by the Municipal Board iii) set out the reasons for the appeal and the specific part of the
- requested amendment to which the appeal applies

The decision of the Council of the Township of Prince is final if a notice of appeal is not received on or before the last day for filing a notice of appeal.

A person or public body that requested an amendment to the official plan of the Township of Prince may appeal the nonapproval of the requested amendment to the Ontario Municipal Board in respect of all or any part of the requested amendment by filing a notice of appeal with the clerk of the Township of Prince.

No person or public body shall be added as a party to the hearing of the appeal unless, before the requested official plan amendment was refused, the person or public body made oral submissions at a public meeting, if any, or written submissions to the council or, in the opinion of the Ontario Municipal Board, there are reasonable grounds to add the person or public body as a party. O. Reg. 543/06, s. 12.

Election information

Who can be a candidate?

Municipal Council

A person who is qualified to be a voter in the Township of Prince's 2014 Municipal Election is also eligible to be a candidate for office. That means, on the day that you submit your Nomination Form, you must be qualified to hold that office. Candidates for the offices of Reeve and Councillor must meet the same criteria as eligible voters or electors. You must be:

√ A resident of the Township of Prince, or an owner or tenant of land in the Township of Prince or the spouse or same sex partner of such an owner or tenant:

√ A Canadian citizen;

At least 18 years old;

 $\sqrt{}$ Not prohibited from voting by law.

School Board Trustee

A candidate for a school board must, upon nomination, be a qualified municipal elector and fulfill all of the following requirements:

 $\sqrt{}$ A resident within the jurisdiction of the board;

√ A supporter of the board;

A Canadian citizen:

√ At least 18 years old.

In order to be considered for declaration as a legally qualified municipal candidate, you must file a Nomination Form and a Declaration of Qualifications for the Town of Prince 2014 Municipal Election. The deadline for filing Nomination Forms is Friday, September 12, 2014 at 2:00 p.m.

Dear Madam Mayor Amaroso and Members of Council:

I would like to formally express my strong support for the resolution which will be presented to City Council on Monday March 3rd, 2014. The passing of this resolution would make the municipality of Sault Ste. Marie a signatory to the Canadian Coalition of Municipalities Against Racism and Discrimination (CCMARD).

Under the umbrella of the Local Immigration Partnership, the Racial Harmony and Social Equity Committee was formed in 2012 in

response to public acts of racism within the community. The mandate of the committee was to develop a resolution to Council and develop a communications strategy for the Local Immigration Partnership to deliver key

messages to the community. Members included representatives from key stakeholders in the community, and held regular monthly meetings. The committee has met its mandate, and today urges the City of Sault Ste. Marie to become a signatory member of CCMARD (Canadian Coalition of Municipalities Against Racism and Discrimination).

The International Coalition of Municipalities Against Racism and Discrimination was formed in 2004 under UNESCO (the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization). Made up of six regional coalitions (Europe, Africa, Asia and Pacific, Arab States, Latin America and the Caribbean, and Canada), the coalition aims to create national and international networks for municipalities to share best practices and recommendations in battling racism and discrimination on a local level.

Joining CCMARD will not only benefit all members of the Local Immigration Partnership, but our regional community at large. The demographics of Sault Ste. Marie are changing, therefore it is crucial that we, as a community, demonstrate our commitment to protect and respect the human rights of all. Becoming a signatory

to CCMARD will enable Sault Ste. Marie to set a Northern Ontario standard of zerotolerance for racism and discrimination, ultimately making our community safer and more attractive for both newcomers and Saultites alike.

I fully support the initiative for Sault Ste. Marie to become a signatory member of CCMARD, and trust that you too will recognize this unique opportunity for our community to grow and lead by example.




