**MUNICIPAL ELECTION 2014  
NOTICE OF NOMINATION**

If you plan to seek office in the 2014 Municipal Election for the below mentioned Council you must file a nomination form with the Clerk before you spend or raise any money for campaign activities.

Nominations may be made by completing and filing in the office of the Clerk, nominations on the prescribed form and accompanied by the prescribed nomination filing fee of \$200.00 for the Head of Council and \$100.00 for all other offices. The filing fee is payable by cash, certified cheque or money order.

Nomination forms are available in the Municipal Office during regular office hours. A nomination must be signed by the candidate and may be filed in person or by an agent during regular business hours between January 2, 2014 and September 12, 2014. Deadline for nominations is 2 p.m. September 12, 2014 (Nomination Day). All completed and filed forms are public documents.

Qualifications – A candidate must be:

1. A resident of the municipality, or a non-resident owner or tenant of land in the municipality, or a spouse of such non-resident
2. A Canadian citizen
3. At least 18 years of age; and
4. Not disqualified by any legislation from holding office.

In the event there are an insufficient number of certified candidates to fill all positions available, nominations will be reopened for the vacant positions only on Wednesday, September 17, 2014 between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. and such additional nominations, if required, may be filed in the township office.

## Recycling

Blue box collection takes place every other Tuesday starting January 15<sup>th</sup>, 2013. Although we do not have "yellow" boxes, we do collect "yellow box" materials, provided it is sorted. We collect:

### Paper

- newspaper/flyers
- magazines
- boxboard/small boxes (cereal boxes, detergent boxes, tissue boxes – plastic liners must be removed)
- cardboard boxes – larger quantities must be bundled 2x2x1' using tape, rope or string (no wire)
- paper egg cartons (not plastic)
- toilet paper/paper towel rolls
- milk/juice cartons – remove plastic cap & collar
- paper ice cream cartons
- paper – writing paper, notebooks, junk mail
- phone books
- wrapping paper
- hard and soft cover books

### Tin

- steel (tin) food cans
- aluminum food and beverage cans
- Aluminum food containers (pie plates, take out food container, aluminum foil)

### Glass and Plastic

- glass bottles and jars (clear and coloured)
- No.1 plastic bottles (pop bottles, water bottles)
- No. 2 plastic bottles (shampoo etc.)

We are advised that the end-markets will not

accept any number 1 or 2 plastics EXCEPT bottles at this time: therefore, we are not able to collect it . Please remember to remove all lids and to wash or rinse all containers. We do not collect plastic bags (this includes pellet bags), aerosol cans (spray cans).

When placing your recycling at the end of the driveway, place it on the opposite side from regular garbage.

When not in use, keep recycling container in a clean and dry area (or cover it up).

Please sort recyclables.

Blue box containers should be placed for collection by 7:30 a.m.

Please remember that the bins in the back of the Township Hall are clearly marked. We do not take broken window glass or mirrors. **DO NOT PLACE GARBAGE OR ITEMS THAT DO NOT BELONG IN THE BINS! REMEMBER THAT WE ONLY TAKE RECYCLING – NO GARBAGE.**



## Taking the School Bus

### How to prepare your child for the school bus

Most mishaps take place outside the bus, so here are some precautions you can take:

- Don't let your children arrive at the stop too early. They may be tempted to wander or get into mischief.
- Make sure they know what to do if they miss the bus: come back home; or if at school, report to a teacher – and never, never accept a ride from a stranger.
- If the stop is a long way from home, plan and discuss with your children where they can go in an emergency.
- If it is dark on the way to or from the bus, make your children visible. Use retro-reflective tape on their clothing and avoid dark colors.
- Make sure they wait well away from the roadway, and stay well back until the bus has come to a full stop and the door opens.
- Explain they must walk at least three metres (10 feet) away when crossing in front of the bus so the driver can see them.
- Forbid running, pushing and horseplay!
- Tell your children to come straight home from the bus no detours.

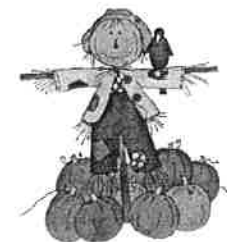
