### CAO'S COUNCIL REPORT



Spring is still trying to make its way to Prince Township. Hopefully it won't be long now.

Council has applied for funding for a Farmer's Market and Cultural Centre. If successful, this structure will have a poured pad and roof that will house a farmer's market through the summer and fall months. Council expects the facility to be used as a multi-purpose

venue in the spring, summer and fall months. When winter arrives, the pad will be able to be flooded to provide a covered services for skating activities throughout the winter.

Union Gas has contracted a company to conduct a phone survey regarding the much anticipated installation of this service in Prince Township. If you have not already received your call, you should expect it soon.

The construction on the west bridge on Base Line and the north bridge on Town Line is expected to get underway soon. The roads will likely be closing in the last week or so of May. Please make sure you give yourself time to commute with this closure.

If you live in the immediate vicinity of either of the two bridges, you will be contacted soon, by the contractors, to have a preconstruction property survey completed. You will also be given information to accommodate garbage and recycling pick-up.

The Prince Township website will be updated periodically to keep residents up to date on the progress of the bridge work. The website also has the council agendas, minutes and by-laws available for the public. Important announcements can be found on the home page. Applications for various planning matters can be found on the site as well.

#### **Barbecue Fire Safety**

As barbecue season begins the Prince Township Volunteer Fire Department want to remind everyone how important it is for the entire family to be savvy about outdoor cooking. All outdoor grills can be extremely dangerous if not cared for and used properly.

#### **Safety at the grill**

Never store combustible materials next to the barbecue.

Before covering or storing your barbecue, make sure it has been shut off, is completely cool and/or has no hot coals.



Never leave the barbecue unattended when in use.

Keep gas hoses away from hot surfaces and hot grease.

Keep children and pets away from the gas valve and the grill.

Keep loose clothing away from the hot barbecue.

Don't put water on a grease fire – it will only cause flames to flare. Use an approved fire extinguisher or baking soda.

Don't operate your barbecue near wooden fences or walls, beneath a combustible roof, under a tree, near vinyl siding or in an enclosed space (such as a garage).

When finished, first turn off the gas valve to allow gas in the hoses to burn off before turning off the burner controls.

Clean the burners and grill regularly to minimize the risk of grease fires.

### **Barbecues**

Before using your barbecue for the first time this season, ensure the barbecue is a certified cooking appliance. Follow manufacturer's specifications for lighting, use and maintenance. Check thoroughly to ensure that all hoses are clear and firmly attached and that there are no leaks or blockages.

### **Propane Cylinder**

Before having a propane cylinder filled, check it for dents, gouges or other signs of disrepair. When having a cylinder filled, ensure that the cylinder is not overfilled. Also, check the expiry

date. You should never use or refill a cylinder that is older than ten years.

### **Setting up your BBQ**

Check to ensure all connections are tight BEFORE turning on the gas. Leaks can be detected by dabbing the connections with a solution of soapy water and turning on the gas momentarily. If bubbles occur, there is a leak that must be fixed before the grill is used. NEVER store spare propane cylinders indoors or near a barbecue, heat source or open flames.

## **Sat 10th May, 2015 will be...World Lupus Day**

**World Lupus Day** aims to raise awareness of a disease that is little known, but can have devastating effects on sufferers and their families. Lupus is a chronic disease that causes the immune system to become overactive, creating antibodies that attack healthy tissue. Lupus can cause pain, inflammation and damage in any part of the body and can be fatal. There is currently no known cure and around

five million people suffer from lupus worldwide.

Lupus Day was first observed in 2004. It was organized by lupus organizations from thirteen countries, who called for governments to increase funding for research, provide better patient services, increase epidemiological data and raise awareness.

Lupus Day is associated with the colour purple, and people can show support by wearing purple clothing or buying special wristbands with the phrase 'Help Us Solve the Cruel Mystery.' A high profile supporter of World Lupus Day is Julian Lennon, who is a Global Ambassador.

## OverDrive – Quick Beginner’s Instructions (Updated April 16, 2015)

- 1) Type [princetwp.ca](http://princetwp.ca) in your web browser. On the Prince Twp’s home page, click on ‘OverDrive Download’ which looks like the picture below. It should bring you to Ontario Library Service Download Centre.



- 2) Or go directly to the website in your browser by typing [downloadcentre.library.on.ca](http://downloadcentre.library.on.ca) and skip Step 1.
- 3) You may have to create an account, depending on the device you are using.

If using a **computer/laptop**, you may be able to sign in directly by clicking ‘Sign in’ which is in the top right corner of the website. When you sign in, it will ask you to enter your library card number, which is the 5 digit number provided by Prince Twp Library. It will also ask you to enter your library’s name which is Prince Township Public Library. You can go directly to Step 6 after you have signed in successfully.

If you are using a device such as a **smartphone, tablet or computer with Windows 8**, you may have to sign up for an OverDrive account with your email address. It is easier if you already have a gmail account. Ex. [ianedoe@gmail.com](mailto:ianedoe@gmail.com)

- 4) If you have to make an account with your email address, you will also have to verify the OverDrive account you made. OverDrive will send an email to the email address you have listed. Please log into the email account and follow the steps in the email to verify your account.
- 5) To sign into OverDrive, click “Sign in” in top right corner of the screen. When you sign in, it will ask you to enter your library card number, which is the 5 digit number provided by Prince Twp Library, and it also will ask you to enter your library’s name which is Prince Township Public Library.
- 6) Once logged in, search for e-books using the search option in the top right, next to the magnifying glass. The e-books have a small icon in the top right corners of their covers. Black means the e-book is available and grey means the e-book is currently checked out; but you can place a hold on the e-book to reserve it once it is available. You can place a hold on the e-book by moving the your mouse over the cover and click “Place a hold”.
- 7) To download an available e-book, move the mouse over the e-book cover and click “Borrow”. You can either download it to your computer/device in one of two formats: EPUB or PDF; or you can read it in the current web browser.
- 8) Check out your bookshelf to view e-books that you have checked out. To go to your bookshelf, click on “Account”. You can check e-books out for 14 days and you are able to renew the e-book for another 14 days as long as someone else has not placed a hold on it.

For smart devices (l-pads, Kobo Arc, etc) - you can download the OverDrive App directly onto your device and skip Steps 1 & 2 by downloading it from your device’s App Store.

The Help section on the OverDrive website is really detailed and provides videos on how to use OverDrive on different devices. Please look at this section if you are having difficulties.
